

Spas and beaches in Budapest

Try them all for the price of just one Citypass, as many times as you wish!

Been partying the whole night long?
Stiff muscles, headache... you know this feeling, don't you?
Have a rest and regenerate on a beach or in a spa!

To get ready for the adventure, here's a short appetizer:



Széchenyi Spa waits for you with 21 pools, sauna, massage and other wellness services. Besides these, the special thermal water of the spa is known as an appetite booster and an aphrodisiac. A great way to demonstrate the effectiveness of the water is taking an example from the nearby zoo, where the pool is filled from the same source and resident hippopotamuses are world famous for their long lives and reproductiveness.

How to get there: by trolley-bus (red electric bus) nr. 72, or by metro nr. 1.
Entry with Citypass: FREE (entry WITHOUT Citypass: approx. 13 EUR).*

In **Gellért Spa** you can take a bath in a pool made of Zsolnay ceramics, while you can also enjoy the cosmetic effect of the water. You can try the wave pool that has been working since 1927, or get special treatments, like a lava rock massage, spa pedicure, chocolate cure, 'Cleopatra bath' or herbal bath.

How to get there: by tram nr. 18, 19, 41, 47, 49, or by bus nr. 7, 173, 86.
Entry with Citypass: FREE (entry WITHOUT Citypass: approx. 14 EUR).*

Lukács Spa was already used by pasha Mustafa (ruler during the Turkish occupation of Hungary in the 17th century), while today the venue is a beloved meeting point of Budapest-based intellectuals, politicians or artists. To refresh yourself, you can try the thermal, swimming and adventure pools, the wellness section, sauna and many wellness treatments, like the chocolate cure or the lava rock massage.

Address: Szt. Lukács Gyógyfürdő és Uszoda, 1023 Budapest, Frankel Leó u. 25-29.

How to get there: by bus nr. 6, 60, 86, by tram nr. 4, 6, 17, or by HÉV suburban railway – direction Batthyány tér.

Entry with Citypass: FREE (entry WITHOUT Citypass: approx. 11 EUR).



Rudas Spa is over 500 years old. It was built during the Turkish occupation, but renewed in 2005 to make sure that you can truly enjoy its extremely high temperature water (thermal pool: 42°C, swimming pool: 29 °C) and follow the old traditions of separated women and men sections. If you got tired during the weekend, relax for a night bath at Rudas! It makes sense to try it, since the water is an appetite booster and an aphrodisiac, while it's also effective against cancer.

Address: Rudas Gyógyfürdő és Uszoda, 1013 Budapest, Döbrentei tér 9.

How to get there: by bus nr. 5, 7, 8, 86, or by tram nr. 18, 19, 41.

Entry with Citypass: FREE (entry WITHOUT Citypass: approx. 10 EUR).

Király Spa is the smaller brother of Rudas, also established in the 17th century, but due to its size it has a more family-like atmosphere. Social bathing all week long!



Address: Király Gyógyfürdő, 1027 Budapest, Fő u. 84.

How to get there: by bus nr. 60, 86.

Entry with Citypass: FREE (entry WITHOUT Citypass: approx. 8 EUR).

Dandár Spa was a public bath, turned to a thermal spa at the beginning of the 20th century. You will find 3 thermal pools and additional services, like sauna, water jet massage, medical massage, refreshing massage and foot care.

Address: Dandár Gyógyfürdő, 1095 Budapest, Dandár u. 3.

How to get there: by tram nr. 2, 24, or by bus nr. 23, 54.

Entry with Citypass: FREE (entry WITHOUT Citypass: approx. 4 EUR).

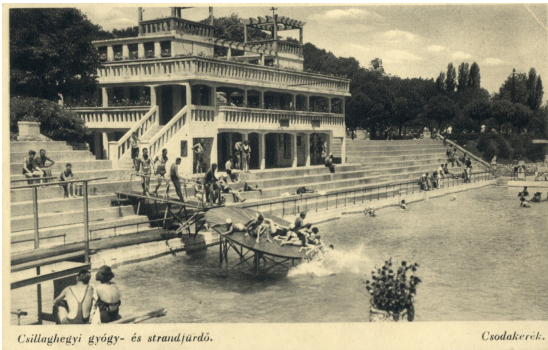
Dagály Beach is waiting for you with a total of 10 pools! Not just thermal, but also adventure pools are available to make you forget about hangover, including flow corridor, bubble bed, whirlpool and neck shower. If you have the energy, you can even play basketball, streetball, or beach volleyball.



Address: Dagály Strandfürdő és Uszoda, 1138 Budapest, Népfürdő u. 36.

How to get there: by metro nr. 3, by tram nr. 1, or by bus nr. 133.

Entry with Citypass: FREE (entry WITHOUT Citypass: approx. 9 EUR).



Csillaghegy Beach is the oldest beach of Budapest, situated on a mountain side, with a balcony structure and surrounded by a natural park. You will find 3 pools there: beach pool, swimming pool and children pool.

Address: Csillaghegyi Strandfürdő és Uszoda, 1038 Budapest, Pusztakúti út 3.

How to get there: by HÉV suburban railway – direction Szentendre, or by bus nr. 42.

Entry with Citypass: FREE (entry WITHOUT Citypass: approx. 9 EUR).

The sources of **Római Beach** were already known in the Roman Empire. It's beach pool is also an adventure facility, including slide-way, neck shower, bubble bath, while the children pool has everything the kids need. At the beach you can find sauna and steam chamber as well.

Address: Római Strandfürdő, 1031 Budapest, Rozgonyi Piroska u. 2.

How to get there: by bus 34, 106, or HEV suburban railway – direction Szentendre.

Entry with Citypass: FREE (entry WITHOUT Citypass: approx. 8 EUR).

Pünkösdfürdő Beach has 3 pools and offers bathing and relaxation. Its huge trees give you shelter after a night of partying and you can also use the sauna with a capacity of 25 people.

Address: Pünkösdfürdői Strand, 1039 Budapest, Királyok útja 272.

How to get there: by bus nr. 34, 145, 146, or by HÉV suburban railway – direction Szentendre.

Entry with Citypass: FREE (entry WITHOUT Citypass: approx. 6 EUR).

Palatinus Beach is situated in the heart of the city at Margaret Island, in the middle of a preserved natural area.



It's pools are filled up with water from thermal springs and they offer you a 5-track slide-way, wave pool, adventure pool, neck shower, bubble bath, flow corridor, fountains and underwater jets. If you feel like playing outside the pools with your friends, you can chose between football, volleyball or soccer tennis. Palatinus also offers you a one-of-its-kind surf program, which is a unique option in Central Europe. If you're not the master of the board yet, you can also take some lessons in the morning hours from the Hungarian Surf Association.

How to get there: by bus nr. 26.

Entry with Citypass: FREE (entry WITHOUT Citypass: approx. 9 EUR).

Paskál Beach is the youngest beach of Budapest, offering 2 pools.

Address: Paskál Strandfürdő, 1141 Budapest, Egressy út 178 f.

How to get there: by trolley-bus (electric bus) nr. 77, 82.

Entry with Citypass: FREE (entry WITHOUT Citypass: approx. 7 EUR).

Csepel Beach has a number of pools, including thermal and swimming facilities and also a 3-track slide-way.

Address: Csepeli Strandfürdő, 1213 Budapest, Hollandi út 14.

How to get there: by bus nr. 71, or by ferry from Pestszenterzsébet

Entry with Citypass: FREE (entry WITHOUT Citypass: approx. 8 EUR).
